Model Lesson Plan for High School Music or Social Studies Classroom (Grades 9-12)

Objective:

Learners will be able to analyze the similarities between the origins, structures, and cultural contexts of jazz and syncretism.

National Core Arts Standards:

Activity:

- 1. Students watch the video: *Pedrito Martinez*. Santero.
- 2. Students read the first two sections of the Khan Academy article about syncretism: *A history of cultural exchange* and *Trade networks and expansion of classical empires: Christianity.*
- 3. Students write a 200-word response to the following prompt:

 Santería is an example of a syncretic religion. How are syncretic religions similar to jazz? Be sure to include information about their origins, structure, and cultural context.

Possible Modifications:

Students may be given an opportunity to respond verbally to prompts.
